
UNDERSTANDING THE ISSUE

EL MUNDO DE ARTÍCULOS - WRITING A PROJECT IN SPANISH CLASSES

Everybody knows that IB students need to be versatile at a variety of different skills, especially in regard to language and communication. The exams test our abilities to comprehend visual and auditory texts but also skills of verbal and written communication. In order to master all of these skills and feel comfortable with the tasks, students need to get as much practice as possible before approaching the exams. This is the reason why we were writing articles with elements of investigation in our Spanish classes.

A while ago our Spanish teacher gave us a captivating assignment. In DP1 Spanish B we need to do a couple of major projects, i.e. a poster featuring the IB learner profile, a recording of an interview and... of course, the article with elements of investigation. For me personally it sounded a little enigmatic at the beginning. I have had an experience in writing articles before, but never in Spanish. I have never heard of the investigation part either, therefore I was curious what it was going to be about.

The general principles were as follows. An article with elements of investigation is a form of written text that is supposed to inform a reader about a given topic, while also providing data taken from self-conducted research. This could be either an interview with an expert, an experiment or a survey. These are called primary sources and are an integral part of every investigative article. The purpose of this task was not only to make us practise writing a rather long form of text but also teach us how to conduct research by ourselves and use the data to create a piece of semi-journalistic work. Acquiring such skills would be helpful in writing our Extended Essays and Internal Assessment.

Another thing worth mentioning is that there were absolutely no limitations regarding the topic of the article. Only the sky was the limit! And well, all of the widely perceived social norms, but you know what I mean. The imagination was the main power here. We divided ourselves into groups of three. Each group has taken a different approach towards choosing the topic. Everyone wanted to delve into their own field of interests but eventually the compromise was reached. My friends and I decided to focus on movies and series, especially the preferences of the students of our school. Another group decided to investigate how people pronounce different words borrowed from the French language e.g. croissant. Another team was testing the knowledge of students about Spain and the last one tried to foresee the results of the UEFA Euro 2024 football cup. All of us got to work as soon as possible.

Different groups have taken different approaches to the conduction of primary research. The type of it was very dependent on the chosen topic. Three of the groups had chosen to use Google Forms to create a questionnaire, which they later sent to their research group. As for the projects regarding films and the knowledge of Spanish culture this group were the students of I LO. But it was not that easy for the girls who wanted to

write about Euro 2024. In order to predict the outcome of the matches the person asked needed to have some relevant knowledge about the current situation in global football i.e. which teams are the best, which footballers score the most goals etc. Therefore they decided to ask the boys training in the local team Piast Gliwice, as their profound interest in this sport was likely to provide insightful information and probable predictions. The last group - the French-pronunciation-checkers used yet another technique which was a little bit more personal. They were approaching people one by one and asked them to read out loud the borrowings while recording it. They later analysed the audio and summarised how different people actually pronounce these words. It was definitely an original idea.

Finally, when all of us handed out the projects to our teacher, it was time to discuss the articles with the class. All groups have done great work while creating the articles and in our own personal way, all of us could be proud of ourselves. It turned out that some people focused more on providing quantitative data: percentages, numerical values. The others put more emphasis on the visual presentation of the data and the article itself. While some of us cared more about the written content, there were also people making sure the article as a whole was good-looking e.g. provided pictures and made it more colourful. In the end, everyone was happy with the results and we received some positive feedback from our teacher, too.

This was definitely one of the most engaging projects we have done in high school. We developed our writing skills in Spanish, learned to conduct primary research and managed to arrange the visual aspect of an article. The process of writing was a very unique experience, especially considering the amount of artistic liberty we were given. The possibility to conduct research ourselves really made us feel like we were journalists. We, the students of Spanish B, highly advise you to try it out yourselves. Who knows, maybe we will see your article in a newspaper one day?





Horrors excel in delving into our innermost fears and stretching the limits of our imagination. 


